Executive Director's Message

EMPOWERMENT IS AN ACTIVE PURSUIT. While Mt. Hood Kiwanis Camp (MHKC) celebrates decades of success in empowering people with developmental disabilities by providing equitable access to the outdoors, our vision remains fixed firmly in the future.

The past year's activity has laid the groundwork for the next chapter of inclusive recreation. We are pushing past old boundaries and setting new benchmarks in our ongoing quest to serve more campers, even better.

Historically, two critical factors have limited MHKC's ability to serve everyone who wants to attend camp: ensuring sufficient staff for our essential 1:1 camper-to-counselor ratio, and having enough accessible housing to meet demand.

We are deeply grateful for MHKC's existing **legacy partnerships** with institutions like Portland State and Pacific Universities, alongside Jesuit and Central Catholic High Schools. And are proud to announce **new partnerships** with the University of Oregon, OHSU, Oregon State, Western Oregon, George Fox, and Southern Oregon Universities, and others in the works. These new collaborations are expected to provide the vital counselor manpower needed to serve more campers in the future.

The second challenge, accessible housing, requires a physical transformation. The present Hemlock dormitory needs to be replaced. Its configuration—45 bunks, half of which are inaccessible due to low ceilings and vertical ladders—does not meet our standard for equitable access. The plan for the new dormitory replacement is ambitious: over 90 bunks in rooms designed with high ceilings and staircases for easier access to upper bunks. The plan is for construction to begin in 2026, with the new building ready for service in 2027.

Together, these two initiatives will **increase MHKC camp capacity by 50%** and create a dynamic new community resource for year-round use.

Operationally, 2026 will present unique, one-time challenges as camp operates at capacity while construction is underway on the new dorm. It might be a little wild for a year! It is a good thing that MHKC is blessed with extraordinary and experienced people supporting our campers and our mission.

Programs



Summer Camp

Mt. Hood Kiwanis Camp enjoyed another successful summer season defined by growth and meaningful camper experiences. One parent shared that after attending another camp, her daughter said MHKC was her favorite because “they don’t treat us like little kids—they challenge us, and I love it.” Feedback like this reflects MHKC’s commitment to empowering campers through engaging, respectful programming.

This summer, camper attendance increased by 20%, supported by new partnerships with universities that expanded our counselor team. We are deeply grateful to our dedicated summer staff—camp directors, supervisors, kitchen, and program staff—who safely delivered high-quality experiences across our pool, equestrian program, adventure course, arts and crafts, and a new addition this year: archery.

New for 2025!

We piloted **Faux Bow Archery** for our F and G groups, expanding our commitment to offering accessible, confidence-building recreation. The equipment allowed campers with diverse physical and motor abilities to fully participate, and the response was **overwhelmingly positive**.

Campers had two choices of bow size with different string strengths, and wore protective arm guards. The lightweight arrows made it fun to aim at the targets about 50 feet away. We saw increased teamwork, focus, and self-confidence as they learned new skills and celebrated trying something new.

This new area quickly became a favorite and will remain part of our growing inclusive program lineup.

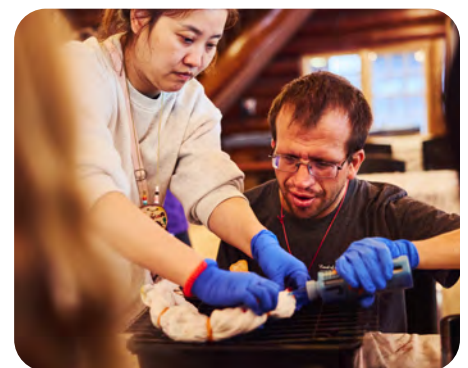

MHKC Legacy 90 Campaign Soars in 2025

Thanks to generous donors, the MHKC Legacy 90 Campaign surpassed the threshold to start construction of our new fully-accessible dorm.

A huge community response to the campaign during the spring and summer months opened the door to start of the construction process: from finalizing architectural plans and securing permits to the final construction scheduled to be completed by Fall 2026.

Completion of the new dorm will likely eliminate waitlists in future years. Replacing a decaying 45-bed facility with a well-designed dormitory means MHKC will be able to accommodate up to 90 campers with comfort and dignity.

The MHKC Legacy 90 Campaign was launched in 2022, with the goal of updating MHKC's aging campus with buildings that promote a feeling of dignity, comfort, and belonging. In 2025, the campaign reached a turning point thanks to an exciting \$150,000 challenge match by **Gary and Linda Pope**. More than 240 donors responded with contributions nearly doubling the challenge goal.

In 2025, the MHKC Legacy 90 capital campaign also earned generous grant funding from the **June and Julian Foss Foundation** to support capital construction costs. The **Boeing Employees Community Fund of Portland**, **Nike Community Impact Fund**, and the **Kuni Foundation** also granted funds to support the new dorm's fully accessible bunk beds to support equitable access and easy transfer for campers who are reliant on wheelchairs for mobility.

MHKC is grateful to each and every Legacy 90 campaign donor for reaching the milestone needed to start construction of the new dorm. As a result of this campaign, MHKC will be able to fulfill our vision of a future in which everyone who wants to go to camp gets to go and stay in fully-accessible, safe, state-of-the-art facilities.

Looking ahead, the Legacy 90 Campaign will continue to secure contributions that invest in the improvement of MHKC's campus to ensure the quality of campers' experience and the sustainability of the camp as a regional treasure.

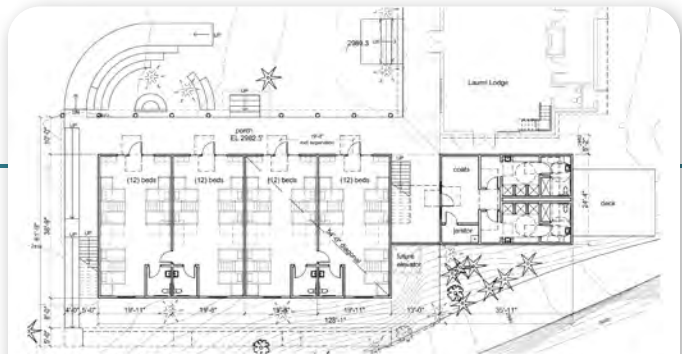

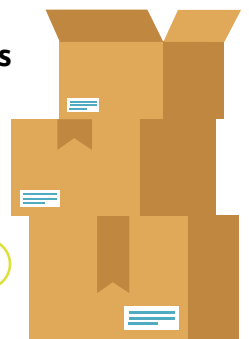

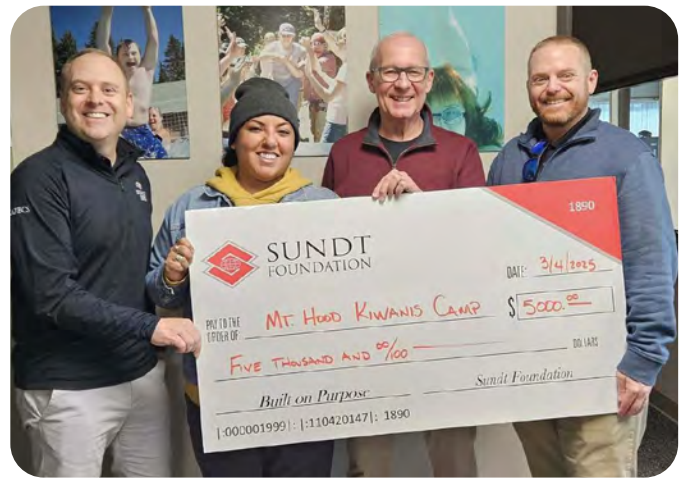
